It is mentioned in the Muratorian fragment in the words Verum ad Philemonem unam, et ad Titum unam et ad Timotheum duas. (Westcott on Canon, p. 529.) One passage is quoted twice by Irenaeus, But as many as separate from the Church, and give heed to such old wives fables as these, are truly self-condemned, and these men Paul commands us after a first and second admonition to avoid. ( Against Heresies, I. cap. xvi., 3, and also III. cap. iii., 3.) By Clement of Alexandria it is quoted at least nine times. One will suffice, Epimenides the Cretan, whom Paul knew as a Greek prophet, whom he mentions in the Epistle to Titus, when he speaks thus, One of themselves, a prophet of their own, said,...
